

ASN Canada FIA Solosport Committee conference call Nov. 27, 2003

The ASN Canadian National Solosport Committee held its sixth conference call November 27, 2003. The following are notes from the meeting to inform the Canadian Solosport Community of their activities:

On going situation in Truro, N.S., concerning Solo II event being shut down :

There is nothing new to report at the present time. Members of ASCC are still in the process of collecting and compiling as much information as possible to put together as a presentation package for when they do meet with the Mayor and Council.

Karting in Solo II:

It has been confirmed at the recent ASN Board meeting that karts will not be eligible to compete in any type of ASN Canada FIA Solosport event. Karts competing in a Solo II style event sanctioned under the current ASN Canada FIA karting rules will be addressed by the National Karting Committee.

Drifting :

CASC OR is still evaluating the proposal and have requested a rule set for evaluation from the club interested in Drifting.

Regional AGM updates :

ARMS :

- There is new Solo Director, Tim Page
- No major changes to the rules
- There is a question on proxy eligibility at the Solo Workshop, ARMS executive to rule on eligibility.

Update: The ARMS Executive have allowed the proxies in question to stand, thereby allowing the election of the new Solo Director to stand.

FAQ :

- There is a new Solo Director – Jean Sirota
- Adopting SCCA - STS and STX classes using Pax factors for 2004
- Rules are moving more towards CNAC but vehicle classifications are moving more towards SCCA
- For the CNAC event, CNAC rules and Classifications will be used
- T-Rex (motorcycle) 3 wheel vehicles are not allowed in Solosport events

CASC - OR :

- There is a new Solo Director, Wes Tanney
- Re writing the current Solo II rules to bring them inline with the CNAC rules

WCMA :

- Adopting the CNAC rules for Regional competition with a strong suggestion that the CNAC rules flow down to club level events.
- Work with the CNAC board to get a better or more balanced representation on the board from across Canada

CACC :

- 65 Solo II events in 2003 w/ two major sponsors
- New Solo Director elected – Henry Threlfall
- New financial model adopted in order to more efficiently manage the funds within the sport
- Rule clarifications and changes discussed and passed
- Still using CACC rules until ASN produces 2005 rules

CNAC Committee :

- The CNAC Board will be undergoing discussions regarding formally incorporating the entity in the new year.
- Topics to include general structure, regional representation, sub-committees

ASN Canada FIA National Solosport Committee :

- At the last ASN Board meeting the question was raised what will happen with the Solosport Committee after the GCR's and Rule Set's are in place. This is something that had not even been thought about and will be discussed down the road.
- The ASN Board are pleased with the progress and are supportive of the Solosport Committee. They ASN will be providing funding for most of the committee's activities including a face to face meeting of the committee early in the new year, translation of the new GCR's into French and a trip to the various Territories by Terry Epp to get a better handle on Solosport in Canada in 2004. The Territories are only asked to pay for the long distance fees for the conference calls.
- The ASN Canada FIA National Solosport GCR's will be ready and in effect for 2004
- The ASN Canada FIA National Solosport Rule Sets for the various forms of Solosport events (autocross, solo II, solo I, hill climb, lapping days, etc.) will be finished and fully in effect for 2005.

ASN Canada FIA National Solosport General Competition Rules :

The draft set of GCR's has been distributed and each member is looking it over for basic errors or omissions in formatting and content. Sections 1 and 2 should be complete by Dec. 3rd, it is proposed to have the remaining sections completed by the first of February. This is all being done by email with a proposed face to face meeting in late February or early March to finalize the GCR's.

Once the Solosport committee has finalized the GCR's they will be passed to the ASN Board for final approval and implementation in all Territories.
